

Prize Awarded to Tukkies Student

Venmyn awarded Kamal Mistry, of the University of Pretoria, a cash prize of ZAR1,000 this week for being the best Geology Honours student to attend Venmyn and Pretoria University's annual Compliance and Reporting Rules in the Minerals Industry course.

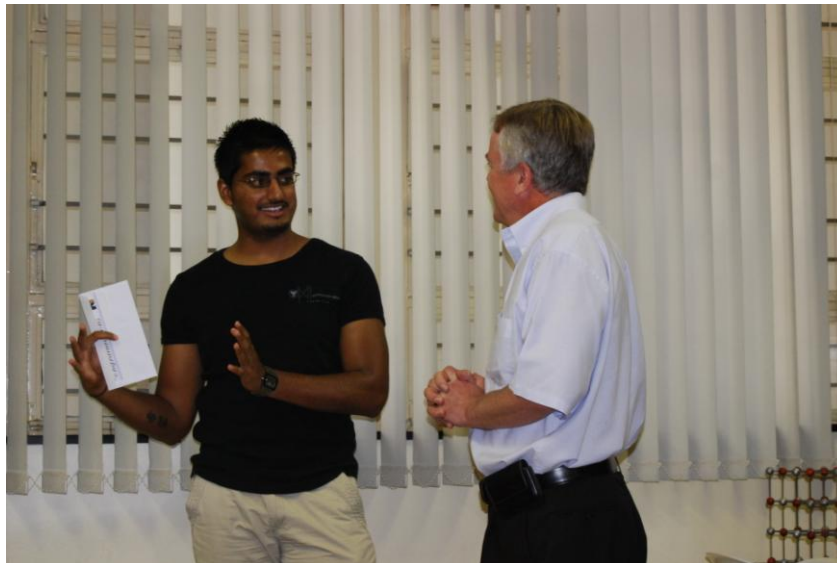
The prize was awarded by Venmyn MD Andy Clay at a ceremony at Lombaard Hall, at the Department of Geology.

Mistry was one of 30 students who participated in the course, which was also attended by 20 external delegates.

The course is considered challenging for students, who are often confronted for the first time with topics related to mineral resource and mineral reserve estimation and valuation, says Clay.

"It is to Mistry's credit that he passed the course while studying for his mid-year Honours exams," he notes.
